The Department of Public Health offers a program culminating in a Bachelor of Health Administration (B.H.A.) degree with a major in Health Administration. The mission of the undergraduate health administration program is to provide students a sound foundation in the values, knowledge and skills necessary for entry level administrative and management positions in the various organizations that make up the health services industry in northeast Florida.

Students interested in long term care management may select course work and an internship that will allow them to qualify to take the Florida Nursing Home Administrator's licensing examination. An opportunity to pursue other special interests is provided with selection of 9-12 hours of elective course work. (Note: the Prerequisites listed below are in effect with the Spring 2008 term at UNF.)
