Taught in conjunction with one another, *Forensic Anthropology* and *Criminal Evidence* serve to provide students with knowledge of evidentiary procedures from crime scene investigation to case presentation. *Forensic Anthropology* will introduce students to those scientific principles, techniques, and methods that are used to solve crimes & aid law enforcement agencies. Students will engage in a variety of projects which will apply the techniques and methods that they learn to collect and interpret evidence. *Criminal Evidence* is designed to provide an understanding of the investigation, compilation and preparation of criminal evidence. The primary goal is to expose students to the legal, theoretical and practical application of evidence for use in the criminal trial process. In addition to classroom learning, students will investigate a facsimile murder case and present it in the form of a mock trial.

Students interested in the CSI: Forensic Investigation linkage will enroll in BOTH the Criminal Justice and Anthropology course as a two-course block.
