To be considered for entrance, you must apply separately to the University Admissions Department and also to the Department of Music via a live or taped audition.

### **Important Things to Know**

+ You should apply to UNF as early in the fall of your senior year as possible. UNF gives out academic scholarships based on GPA and test scores, but you must apply to the university by the November deadline.

+ Getting accepted to the Department of Music is different from getting accepted to UNF. You will need to take an audition for department acceptance and for scholarship consideration. Some students get accepted to UNF, but not the Department of Music and vice versa.

+ Auditions take place in February and March of your senior year, with one fall audition date and the option to set up an appointment for a different date if you can't make any of the auditions. (This is discouraged.)

+ General audition requirements are listed on the UNF music website and more specific audition advice is available by contacting the professor who teaches your instrument/voice.

+ We offer degrees in Music Performance, Music Education, and Jazz Studies. The course work and info for each degree is located on the UNF music website.

+ Students can make an appointment with UNF Admissions to take a campus tour and can also set up an appointment to meet with music faculty and tour the music facilities. Some faculty members may be available to give a complementary lesson during your visit.

+ UNF's Department of Music consists of highly talented and motivated students learning in a focused, intimate environment. Acceptance to the department is based on the incoming student's ability meeting our expectations for enrollment and availability for new students in our teaching studios.
