Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report use of alcohol (past 30 days), as measured by the *Duval Alcohol, Tobacco, Other Drugs, and Violence Survey: Knowledge, Attitudes, and Behavior* (Duval Survey). The baseline statistic from the 1999 Duval Survey is 24.6%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of wine coolers (past 30 days), as measured by the Duval Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1999 Duval Survey is 19.5%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the number of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days), as measured by the Duval Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1999 Duval Survey is 19.1%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of smokeless tobacco

(past 30 days), as measured by the Duval Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1999 Duval Survey is 5.5%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of marijuana (past 30 days), as measured by the Duval Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1999 Duval Survey is 10.6%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use (past 30 days) of other drugs (excluding alcohol, tobacco, or marijuana), such as inhalants, over-the-counter drugs, LSD, amphetamines, designer drugs, tranquilizers, narcotics, cocaine, rohypnol, and crystal methamphetamine, as measured by the Duval Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1999 Duval Survey is 5.9%.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who are reported for battery, as measured by the *Student Conduct Code Violations Summary Report* (SCCVS). The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 SCCVS is 4.2%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who are reported for fighting, as measured by the SCCVS. The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 SCCVS is 5.1%.

Safe and Drug Free Schools Program 2000-2001 Profiles

By June 30, 2005, to maintain or improve by an average of 0-2% the percentage of targeted students (50 students per ZIP Counselor) in grades 6-12 who will maintain or show improvement in areas of ATOD use, academic achievement, attendance, discipline, and locus of control, as measured by the ZIP Counselors' Final Reports. The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 ZIP Counselors' Final Report is 78%.
