Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades K-12 who report current use of “gateway” drugs, as measured by the *Pride Survey*. The baseline statistic from the 1999 Lake County Pride Survey is that 25% of students surveyed reported using gateway drugs one or more times in the last year, or monthly, weekly, or daily.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, decrease by 25% the number of disorderly conduct, fighting, and threat and intimidation incidents per 1,000, as measured by the *School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR)* Report. According to the 1999-2000 SESIR Report there were 17.6 incidents per 1,000 students of disorderly conduct, 21.0 per 1,000 of fighting, and 8.7 per 1,000 of threat and intimidation.

By June 30, 2005, increase by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report feeling safe at school, as measured by the *PRIDE Survey*. The baseline statistic
