**Project Goals**

***ATOD Prevention***

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 5% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days), as measured by the *Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey* (FYSAS). According to the 2000 FYSAS, the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days) was 16.5%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 5% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of smokeless tobacco (past 30 days), as measured by the *Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey* (FYSAS). According to the 2000 FYSAS, the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of smokeless tobacco (past 30 days) was 10.0%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 5% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of alcohol (past 30 days), as measured by *Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey* (FYSAS). According to the 2000 FYSAS, the percentage of students in

grades 6-12 who report current use of alcohol (past 30 days) was 22.3%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 5% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of marijuana (past 30 days), as measured by the *Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey* (FYSAS). According to the 2000 FYSAS, the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of marijuana (past 30 days) was 9.5%.

***Violence Prevention***

By the year 2005, to decrease by 5% aggressive behavior in students grades 2-12, as measured by the *Health Promotion Wave Modified Aggression Scale*. The baseline statistic will be established in the 2000-2001 Health Promotion Wave Modified Aggression Scale.
