By the year 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days), as measured by the FYS. The baseline statistic from the FYS is NYA.

By the year 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of marijuana (past 30 days), as measured by the FYS. The baseline statistic from the FYS is NYA.

By the year 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of any illicit drug excluding marijuana (past 30 days), as measured by the FYS. The baseline statistic from the FYS is NYA.

***Violence Prevention***

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the number of incidents of fighting per 1,000 K-12 students, as indicated by the *Okaloosa County School Crime and Violence Incident Report* (SCVIR). According to the 1999-2000 SCVIR, the baseline statistic for the number of incidents of fighting is 14 per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the number of incidents of threat and/or intimidation per 1,000 K-12 students, as indicated by the SCVIR. According to the 1999-2000 SCVIR, the baseline statistic for the number of incidents of threat and/or intimidation is 5.5 incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12.
