Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to increase the mean age of first use of alcohol by 2.5 years among students in grades 6-12, as measured by the *Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey* (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 1999 FYSAS is 12.1 years.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the percentage of students in grades K-12 who receive discipline referrals for rebellious behavior (including disrespect, insubordination, and defiance), as measured by school discipline reports. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 school discipline reports is 19%.
