***ATOD Prevention***

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report binge drinking, as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS is 12.4%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of alcohol (past 30 days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS is 18.1%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS is 8.1%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of smokeless tobacco (past 30 days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS is 5.1%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of marijuana (past 30 days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS is 4.6%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of any illicit drug excluding marijuana (past 30 days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS is 5.3%.

***Violence Prevention***

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR). According to 1999-2000 SESIR data, the number of fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12 is 62.97.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of vandalism incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. According to 1999-2000 SESIR data, the number of vandalism incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12 is 4.70.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of weapons possession incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. According to 1999-2000 SESIR data, the number of weapons possession incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12 is 1.09.
