Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the number of tobacco-related referrals per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR). The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 SESIR is 8.7 incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the number of drug-related referrals per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. The baseline statistic

from the 1998-1999 SESIR is 2.38 incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report binge drinking, as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS is 16%.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of fights per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. According to 1999-2000 SESIR data, there were 23.11 fights per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of battery incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. According to 1999-2000 SESIR data, there were 12.21 battery incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of weapons possession incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. According to 1999-2000 SESIR data, there were 22 weapons possession incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12.
