Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 40% the incidents of tobacco use per 1,000 students in grades 6-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR). According to the 2000-2001 SESIR, there were six tobacco incidents per 1,000 students in grades 6-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who reported for alcohol use, as measured by the 2004-2005 district Information Systems Discipline Report (ISDR). According to the 1999-2000 ISDR, 1.5% of students in grades 6-12 were reported for alcohol use.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of incidents of other drug use per 1,000 students in grades 6-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. According to the 2000-2001 SESIR, there were 4 incidents per 1,000 students in grades 6-12 of other drug use.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 30% the number of incidents of violence (scuffling, fighting, weapons, battery, threatening, and bullying) per 1,000 students in grades 6-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 ISDR. According to the 1999-2000 ISDR, there were 10 incidents of violence per 1,000 students in grades 6-12.
