**Project Goals**

**ATOD Prevention**

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report being drunk or high at school (past 12 months), as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). According to the 1999-2000 FYSAS, the percentage of students in grades

6-12 who reported being drunk or high at school is 12.9%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report smoking cigarettes in the last 30 days, as measured by the 2004-2005 FYSAS. According to the 1999-2000 FYSAS, the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who reported smoking cigarettes in the last 30 days is 16.2%.

**Violence Prevention**

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR). According to the 1998-1999 SESIR, the number of fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12 is 62.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of threat and intimidation incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. According to the 1998-1999 SESIR, the number of threat and intimidation incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12 is 24.8.
