Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the percentage of students in grades 5-12 who report recent use of alcohol, as measured by the 2004-2005 Prevalence Survey of Substance Use Among Pinellas County Students (PSSUAPCS). The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 PSSUAPCS is 35%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the percentage of students in grades 5-12 who report recent use of tobacco, as measured by the 2004-2005 PSSUAPCS. The baseline

statistic from the 1999-2000 PSSUAPCS is 21%.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the percentage of students in grades 5-12 who report missing school due to safety concerns, as measured by the 2004-2005 PSSUAPCS. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 PSSUAPCS is 11%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the percentage of students in grades 5-10 who are suspended from school for defiance or insubordination, as measured by the 2004-2005 Pinellas County Schools Suspension Report (PCSSR). The baseline statistic from the July 1999-2000 PCSSR is 17%.
