Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who are reported for disruptive/disrespectful behavior as measured by School Incident Report data. According to the 2000-2001 School Incident Report data 36% of the total referrals were for disruptive/disrespectful behavior.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the percentage of students grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days), as measured by the Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). According to the 1999-2000 FYSAS, 22.4% of students grades 6-12 reported they had smoked within the last 30 days.
