Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to maintain an annual average of alcohol-related incidents of less than 1 per 100 students K-12 based on 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR) data. The baseline statistic from the 2001-2002 SESIR for alcohol-related incidents for K-12 was 0.43 incidents per 100 students in K-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease the percentage of tobacco-related incidents of students K-12 by 25%, based on 2004-2005 SESIR data. The baseline tobacco incident statistic from the 1999-2000 SESIR data was 3.5 incidents per 100 K-12 students.

By June 30, 2005, to maintain an annual average of drug-related incidents of students in grades K-12 to less than 1 per 100 students, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 SESIR for drug-related incidents among students in grades K-12 was 0.43 incidents per 100 K-12 students.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease the percentage of violence-related incidents (assault, battery, sexual harassment, sexual offenses, threat and intimidation, and fighting) of students in grades K-12, as measured by 2004-2005 SESIR data. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 SESIR for violence-related incidents was 8 per 100 K-12 students

By June 30, 2005, to decrease the percentage of theft and vandalism-related incidents among students in grades K-12, as measured by 2004-2005 SESIR data. The baseline statistic from the 2000-2001 SESIR for theft and vandalism-related incidents was 2 per 100 K-12 students.
