Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 FYSAS was 21.8%.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease the number of suspensions of students in grades K-12 who are disciplined for activities that result in in-school or out-of-school suspension by 25% as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida

Department of Education Discipline Data (FDOEDD). The baseline statistics per 1000 from the 1999-2000 FDOEDD were as follows:
