Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the number of incidents of alcohol use on campus per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR) data. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 SESIR was .88 incidents of alcohol use incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the number of incidents of tobacco use per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR) data. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 SESIR

data is 7.97 incidents of tobacco use per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the number of incidents of illicit drug use per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR) data. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 SESIR was 1.66 incidents of illicit drug use per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the number fighting incidents per 1,000 K-12 students, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR) data. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 SESIR was 17.79 fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the number threat and intimidation incidents per 1,000 K-12 students, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR) data. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 SESIR was 9.29 threat and intimidation incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12.
