Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days), as measured by the Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2001-2002 FYSAS was 15.8%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of smokeless tobacco (past 30 days), as measured by the Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2001-2002 FYSAS was 3.4%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who

report current use of alcohol (past 30 days), as measured by the Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 FYSAS was 33.1%.

By June 30, 2005, to increase the mean age of first use of alcohol by 2.5 years among students in grades 6-12, as measured by the FYSAS. The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS was 12.3 years.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current illicit drug use (past 30 days), as measured by the FYSAS. The baseline statistic from 2000 FYSAS was 17.8%.

By June 30, 2005, to increase the mean age of first use of marijuana use by 2.5 years among students in grades 6-12, as measured by the FYSAS. The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS was 13.3 years.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of discipline incidents in grades 4-12 per 1000 students which are substance-related (ATOD), as measured by the Pasco District School Board MIS Discipline Report. The baseline statistic from the 1999 District School Board MIS Discipline Report was 9.85 incidents per 1,000 students in grades 4-12.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to increase by 25% the number of parents who feel their student is safe from violence in Pasco County Schools, as measured by the Parent Satisfaction Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 Parent Satisfaction Survey was 55.4%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the number of referrals per 1,000 students in grades K-12 for use of profane, obscene, or abusive language or gestures (code 3A); defiance of authority (code 3B, 2G); fighting (code 2F, 3D); intimidation (code CO); harassment (code 3P); and sexual harassment (code 3I), as measure by district discipline referral data. The combined

baseline statistic from the 1999 district discipline referral data was 308.4 per 1,000 students.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of weapons possessions incidents per 1,000 students, as measured by the School Environmental Safety Incidents Report (SESIR). The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 was 1.45 weapons possession incidents per 1,000 students.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report having attacked someone with the idea of causing serious harm, as measured by the FYSAS. The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS was 13.4%.

By June 30, 2005, to increase by 25% the percentage of parents of students in grades K-12 who feel that their child is safe from violence in Pasco County Schools, as measured by the 2004-2005 Parent Satisfaction Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1999-2000 Parent Satisfaction Survey was 55.4%.
