Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days) as measured by the 2004-2005 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2001 FYSAS for students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days) was 18.0%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of illicit drugs excluding marijuana (past 30 days) as measured by the 2004-2005 FYSAS. The baseline statistic from the 2001 FYSAS for students in grades 6-12 who report current use of illicit drugs

excluding marijuana (past 30 days) was 8.3%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of marijuana (past 30 days) as measured by the 2004-2005 FYSAS. The baseline statistic from the 2000 FYSAS for students in grades 6-12 who report current use of marijuana (past 30 days) was 13.4%.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the number of sexual harassment incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR). The baseline statistic for sexual harassment incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12 was 1.86%, as measured by the from the 1998-1999 SESIR.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 50% the percentage of reported fights among students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR Report. The baseline statistic for reported fights among students in grades K-12 was 19.86%, as measured by the 1998-1999 SESIR Report.
