Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of alcohol (past 30 days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Duval Alcohol, Tobacco, Other Drugs, and Violence Survey: Knowledge, Attitudes, and Behavior (Duval Survey). The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 Duval Survey for the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of alcohol (past 30 days) was 24.6%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30

days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Duval Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 Duval Survey for the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of cigarettes (past 30 days) was 19.1%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of smokeless tobacco (past 30 days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Duval Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 Duval Survey for the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of smokeless tobacco (past 30 days) was 5.5%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of marijuana (past 30 days), as measured by the 2004-2005 Duval Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 Duval Survey for the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use of marijuana (past 30 days) was 10.6%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use (past 30 days) of illicit drugs (excluding alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana), as measured by the 2004-2005 Duval Survey. The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 Duval Survey for the percentage of students in grades 6-12 who report current use (past 30 days) of illicit drugs (excluding alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana) was 6.2%.

Violence Prevention

By June 2005, to decrease by 10% the number of threat and intimidation incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR). According to 1998-1999 SESIR data, there were .32 threat and intimidation incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

By June 2005, to decrease by 10% the number of battery incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. According to 1998-1999

Safe and Drug Free Schools 2004-2005 District Profiles

SESIR data, there were 4.05 battery incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the number of fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 SESIR. According to 1998-1999 SESIR data, there were 36.25 fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12.

By June 30, 2005, to maintain or improve by an average of 2% the percentage of targeted students (50 students per ZIP counselor) in grades 6-12 who will maintain or show improvement in ATOD use prevention, academic achievement, attendance, discipline, and locus of control, as measured by the 2004-2005 ZIP Counselors' Final Reports (ZCFR). The baseline statistic from the 1998-1999 ZCFR for the percentage of targeted students who maintained or showed improvement in the above areas was 78%.

By June 30, 2005, to increase by 10% the number of positive responses by students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 *Foundations: Creating a Safe and Civil Climate Survey-students*. The baseline statistic from the 2003-2004 *Foundations: Creating a Safe and Civil Climate Survey-students* was 63%.

By June 30, 2005, to increase by 10% the number of positive responses by students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 *Foundations: Creating a Safe and Civil Climate Survey-staff*. The baseline statistic from the 2003-2004 *Foundations: Creating a Safe and Civil Climate Survey-staff* was 73%.

By June 30, 2005, to increase by 10% the number of positive responses by students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 *Foundations: Creating a Safe and Civil Climate Survey-parents*. The baseline statistic from the 2003-2004 *Foundations: Creating a Safe and Civil Climate Survey-parents* was 72%.
