ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to maintain the number of alcohol incidents per 1000 students in 9th grade, as measured by the 2004-2005 Franklin District Discipline Report (FDDR). The baseline statistic from the 2003-04 FDDR was 0.

By June 30, 2005, to reduce by 5% the number of drug excluding alcohol incidents per 1,000 students in grades PK-8, as measured by the 2004-2005 Franklin District Discipline Report (FDDR). According to the 2000-2001 FDDR, the baseline statistic was 3.1 drug incidents per 1,000 students in grades PK-8.

By June 30, 2005, to reduce by 5% the number of tobacco incidents per 1,000 students in grades PK-8, as measured by the

2004-2005 Franklin District Discipline Report (FDDR). According to the 2000-2001 FDDR, the baseline statistic was 3.1 tobacco incidents per 1,000 students in grades PK-8.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to reduce by 5% the number of fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades PK-8, as measured by the 2004-2005 Franklin District Discipline Report (FDDR). According to the 2000-2001 FDDR, the baseline statistic was 18.3 fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades PK-8.

By June 30, 2005, to reduce by 5% the number of battery incidents per 1,000 students in grades PK-8, as measured by the 2004-2005 Franklin District Discipline Report (FDDR). According to the 2000-2001 FDDR, the baseline statistic was 4.1 battery incidents per 1,000 students in grades PK-8.
