Project Goals

ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the current use of alcohol (past 30 days) by all students in grades 6-12, as measured by the Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the FYSAS was 32.9%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the current use of cigarettes (past 30 days) by all students in grades 6-12, as measured by the Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the FYSAS was 27.1%.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 25% the current use of marijuana (past 30 days) by all students in grades 6-12, as measured by the Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the FYSAS was 14.9%.

Violence Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 20% the number of incidents of fighting per 1,000 students in grades K-12, as measured by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR). The baseline statistic from 1999-2000 SESIR data was 20.47 per 1,000 students in grades K-12.
