ATOD Prevention

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 10% the number of alcohol, tobacco, and other illicit drug use incidents per 1,000 for PreK-12 students, as indicated by the 2004-2005 School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR). According to 1999-2000 SESIR data, there were 1.72 incidents per 1,000 students in grades PreK-12.
