**Project Goals**

***ATOD Prevention***

By June 30, 2005, the number of student tobacco incidents per 1,000 students will be reduced by 5% in grades 6-12, district-wide, as measured by the 2004-2005 Jackson County Discipline Report. According to the 2000-2001 Jackson County Discipline Report, the baseline statistic was 9.7 incidents per 1,000 students in grades 6-12, district-wide.

By June 30, 2005, the number of student drug incidents per 1,000 students will be reduced by 5% in grades 6-12, district-wide, as measured by the 2004-2005 Jackson County Discipline Report. According to the 1999-2000 Jackson County Discipline

Report, the baseline statistic was 4.9 incidents per 1,000 students in grades 6-12, district-wide.

By June 30, 2005, to decrease by 5% the current use of alcohol (past 30 days) by all students in grades 9-12, as measured by the Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS). The baseline statistic from the 2002 FYSAS was 42.4%.

***Violence Prevention***

By June 30, 2005, the number of student fighting incidents per 1,000 students will be decreased by 5% in grades K-12, district-wide, as measured by the 2004-2005 Jackson County Discipline Report. The baseline statistic, according to the 1999-2000 Jackson County Discipline Report was 74.9 fighting incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12, district-wide.

By June 30, 2005, the number of student battery incidents will be decreased by 5% in grades K-12, district-wide, as measured by the 2004-2005 Jackson County Discipline Report. The baseline statistic, according to the 1999-2000 Jackson County Discipline Report was 24.7 battery incidents per 1,000 students in grades K-12, district-wide.
