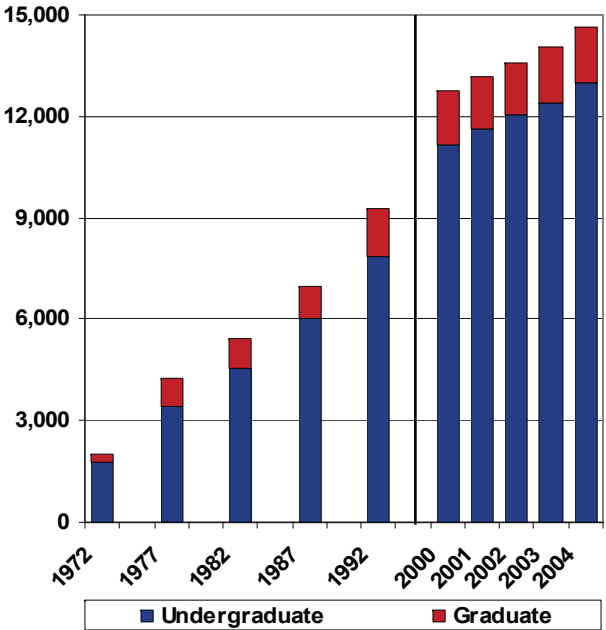

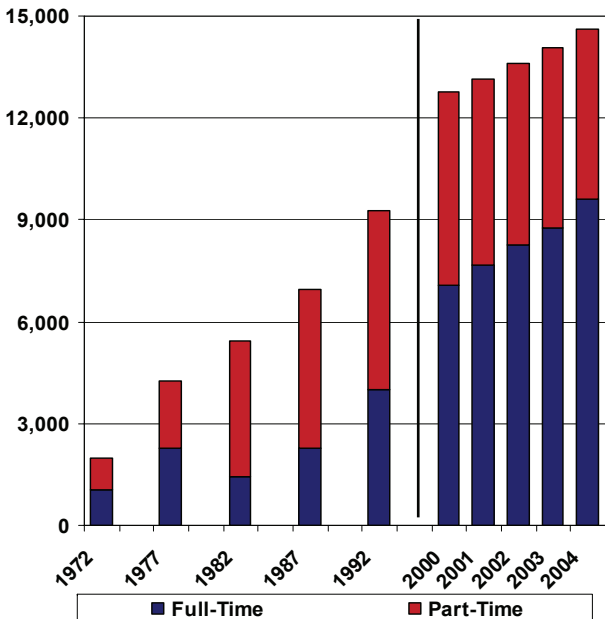

Fall Student Headcounts By Full-Time/Part-time Status



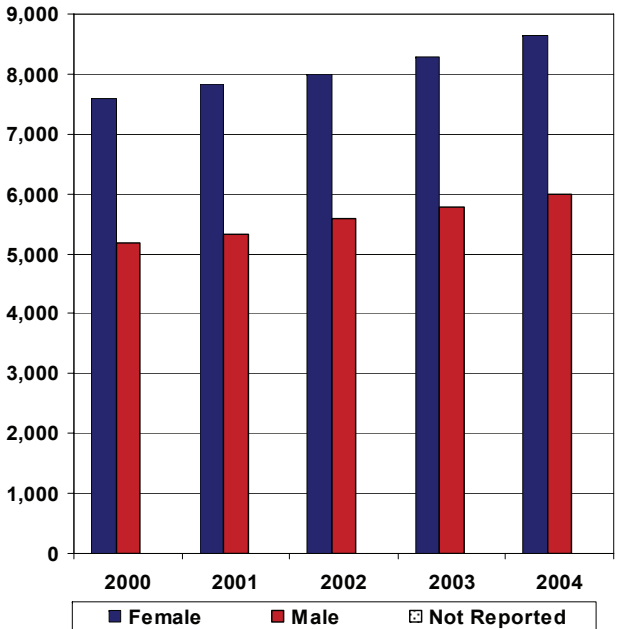

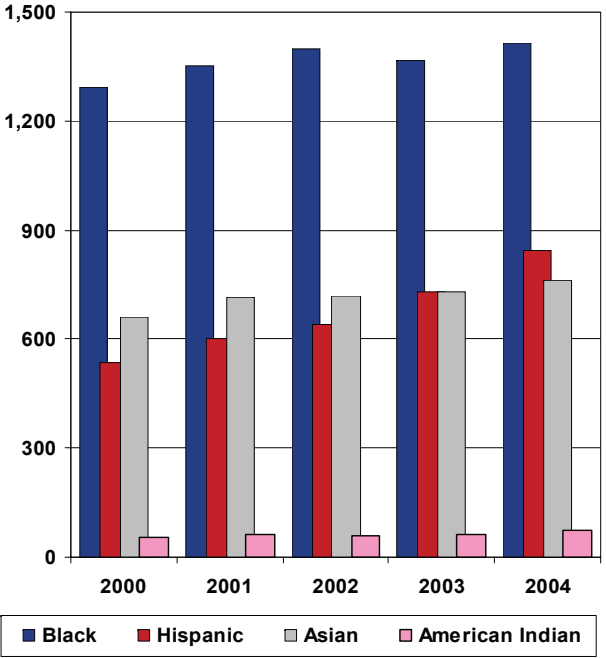

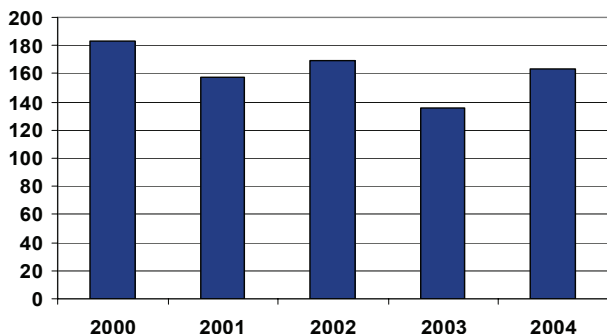

Fall Student Headcounts International Students



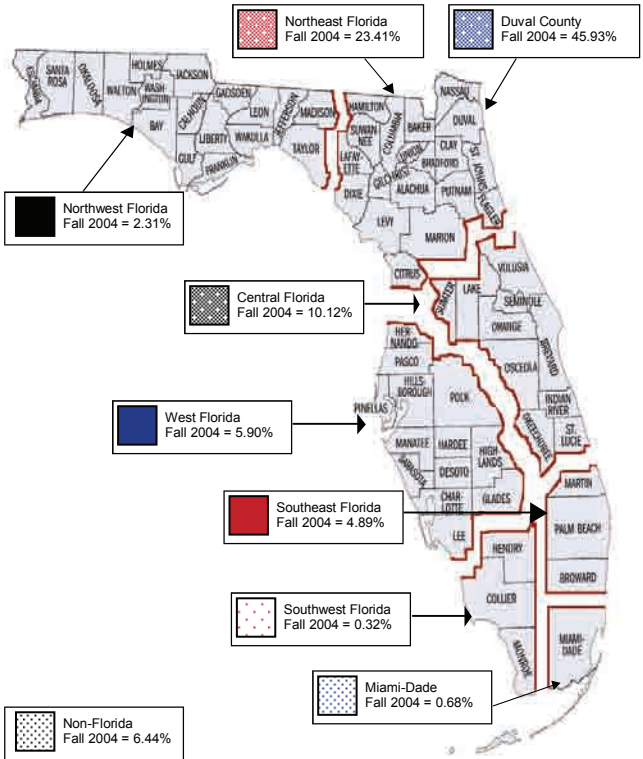

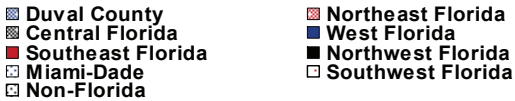
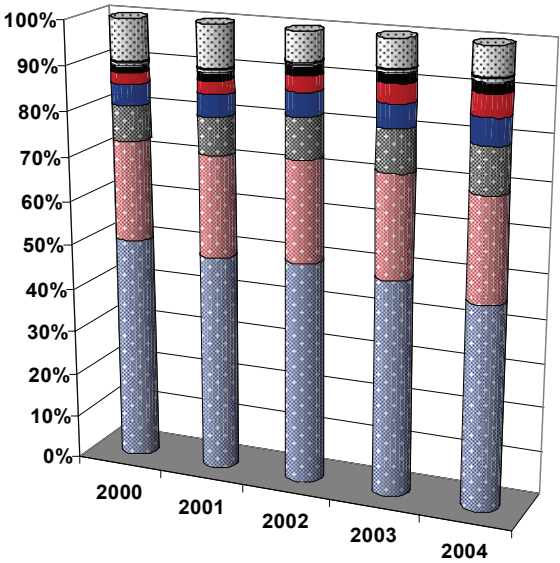

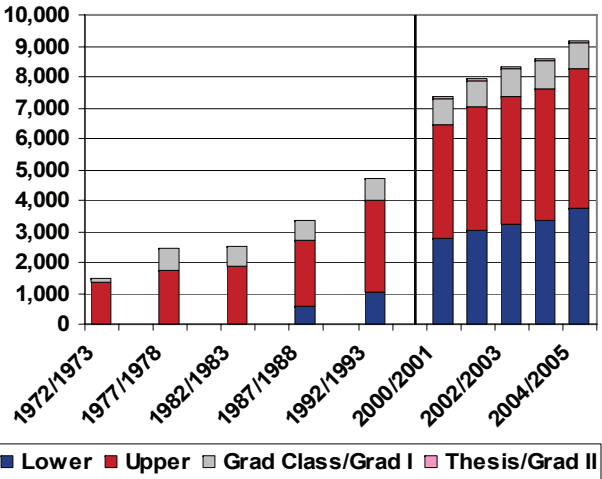

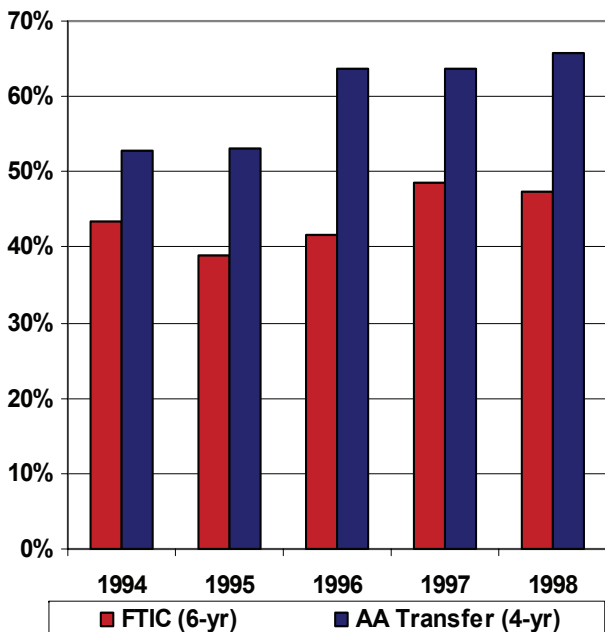

By Student Type—Fall Cohorts**



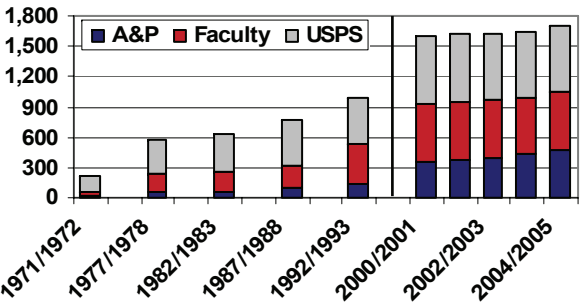

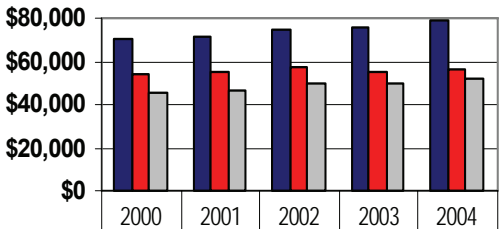

By Rank**

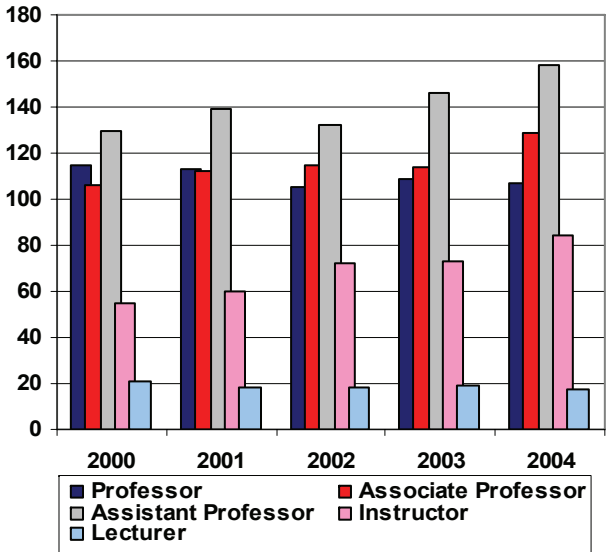

Fall Faculty Headcounts By Rank



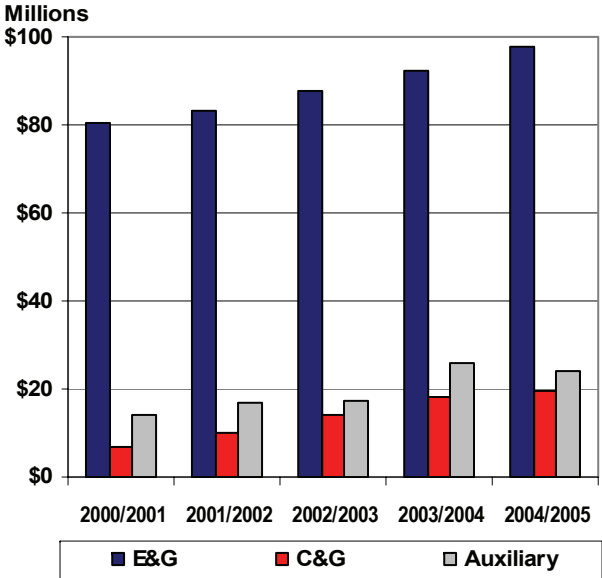

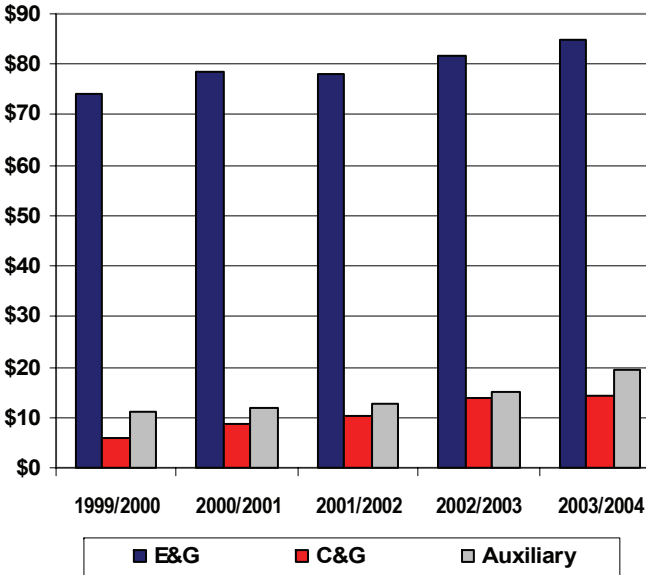

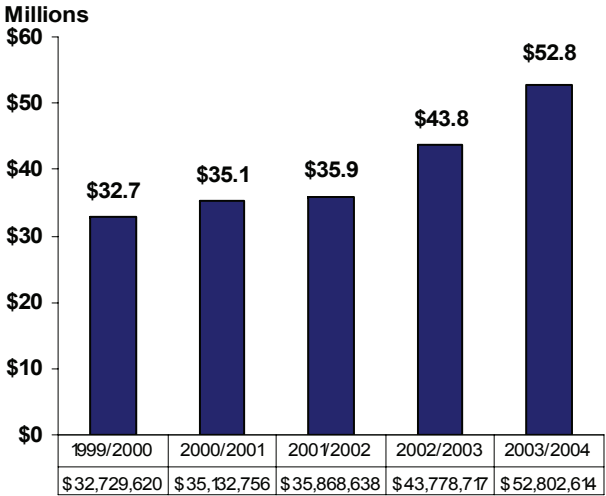

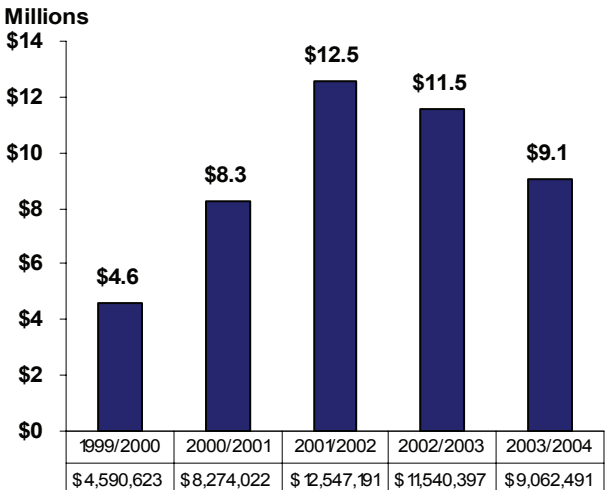

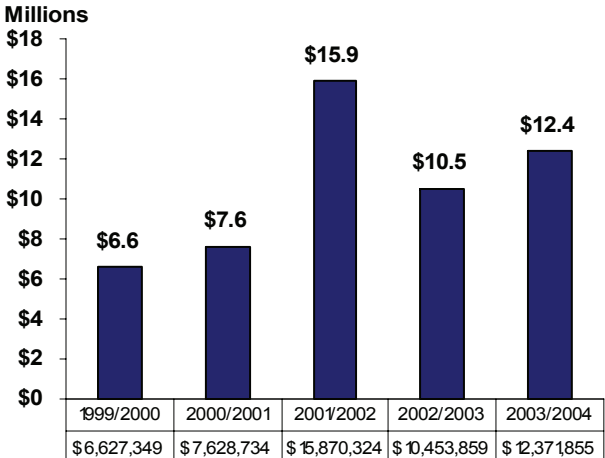
UNF Foundation Gift Totals

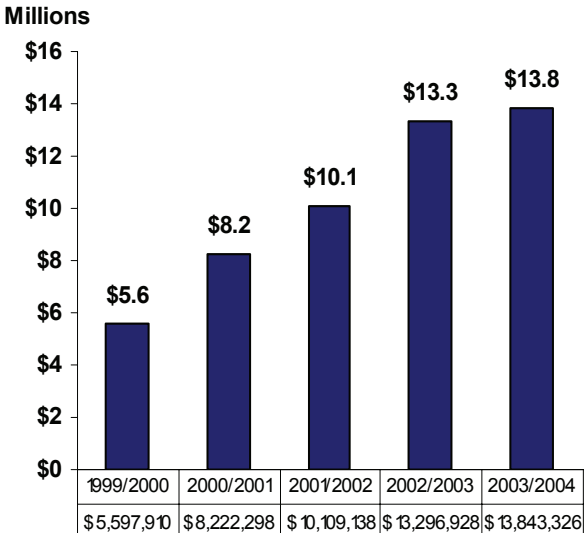
