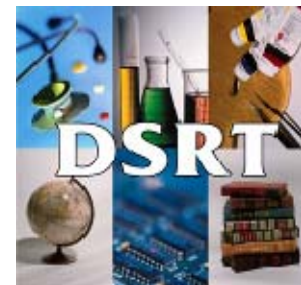

SECTION I: INTRODUCTION

MISSION STATEMENT

A Commitment to Excellence, Focus, Relevance, and Accountability



The Division of Sponsored Research and Training (DSRT) serves as the University's central administrative unit responsible for securing external resources through grants and contracts and providing financial and contractual stewardship of awards. DSRT provides dynamic and proactive services to cultivate and maximize external resources for relevant research, scholarly and creative pursuits. DSRT provides guidance and support to the university community in an environment that fosters the creative process and the enrichment of students and teaching, while ensuring protection of the university's financial, contractual, and regulatory obligations as well as accountability to external funding sources.

THE YEAR IN REVIEW

Sponsored project expenditures at UNF rose by 3% and the value of awarded projects increased nearly 12% from the previous fiscal year.

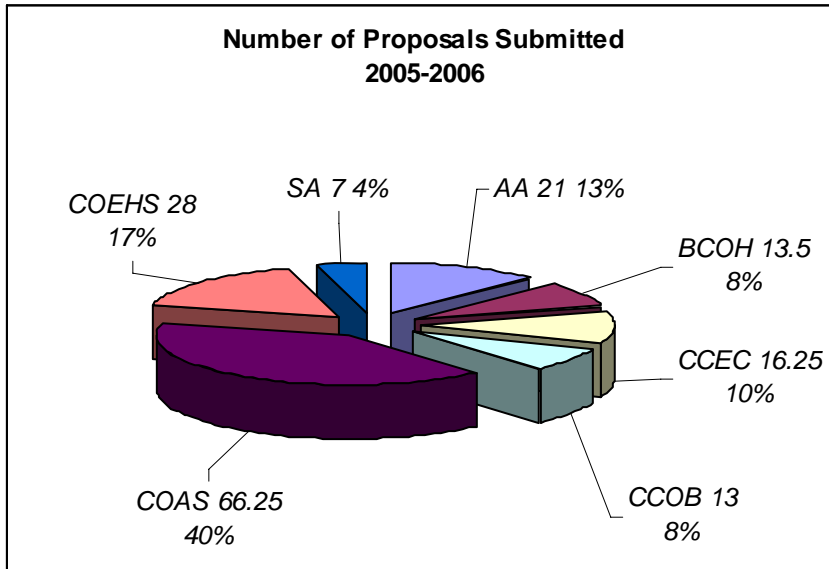
Growth is planned to accommodate the growing importance placed on research and scholarly activity on campus and the total transformational learning opportunity experience promulgated at UNF. This growth will allow DSRT to provide more comprehensive service to those faculty and staff members already involved in external funding activities and, hopefully, encourage new faculty and staff to explore the benefits of external funding.

Among the changes planned are a name change to the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs, which will bring the department into alignment with other universities around the state, and the creation of staff positions dedicated to assisting principal investigators with the administrative burden of sponsored activities. These changes have already begun with the hiring of Dr. Imeh Ebong, Assistant Vice President for Research, and the preparation of new office space allowing the entire department to be centrally located on campus and within one office.

This annual report shows where DSRT and University have been in the past fiscal year and provides information regarding sponsored project activity trends. UNF plans to continue to soar in the sponsored projects arena in the future.

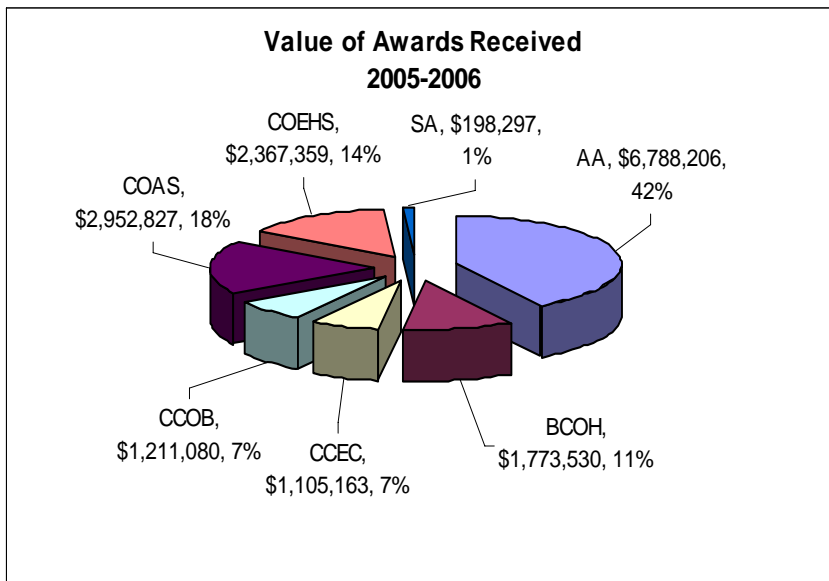

The faculty and staff at UNF submitted 165 proposals in Fiscal Year 2005-2006, an increase of 11.5% compared to the previous fiscal year.

UNF received 133 awards totaling \$16,396,461.25 in Fiscal Year 2005-2006, an 11.8% increase compared to the previous fiscal year.

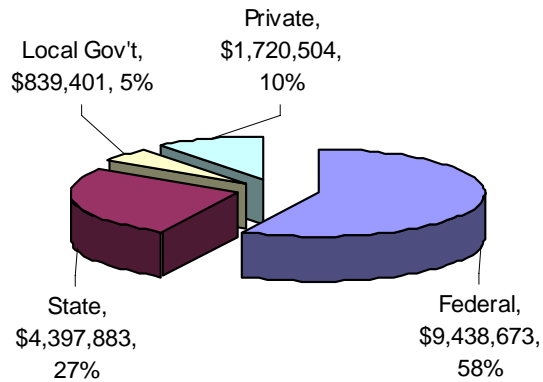

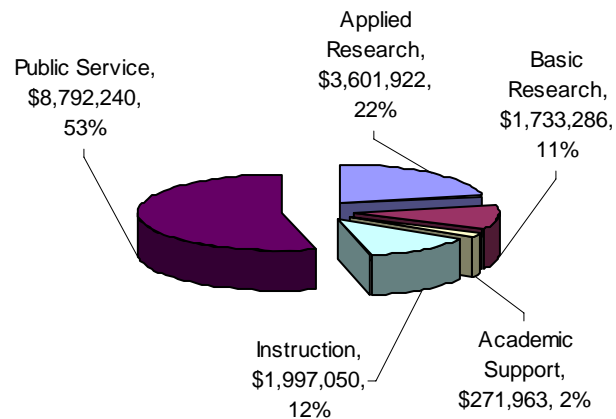
Awards by Sponsor Type

UNF received the majority of its sponsored programs funding from Federal or Federal flow-through projects, followed by State agencies, Local Government agencies, and finally Private sponsors.

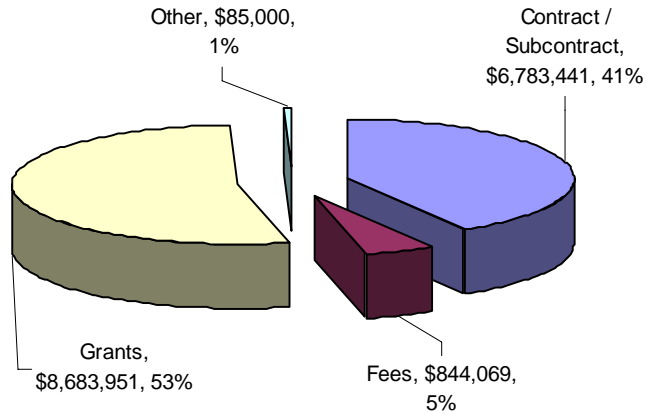
Awards by Project Type

Awards by Funding Mechanism

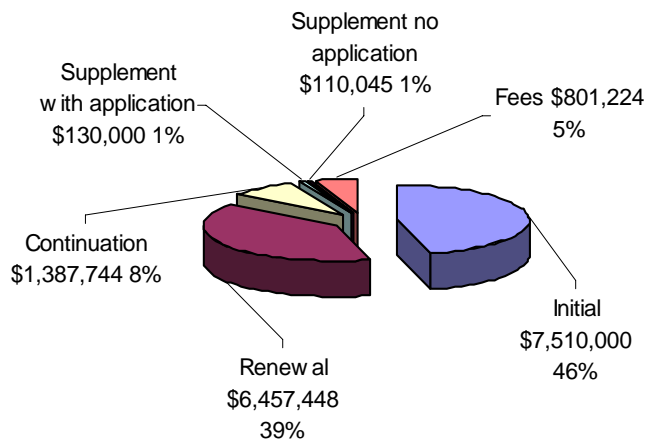


Awards by Funding Mechanism

New awards make up the largest form of funding received this Fiscal Year, closely followed by renewals of existing projects.

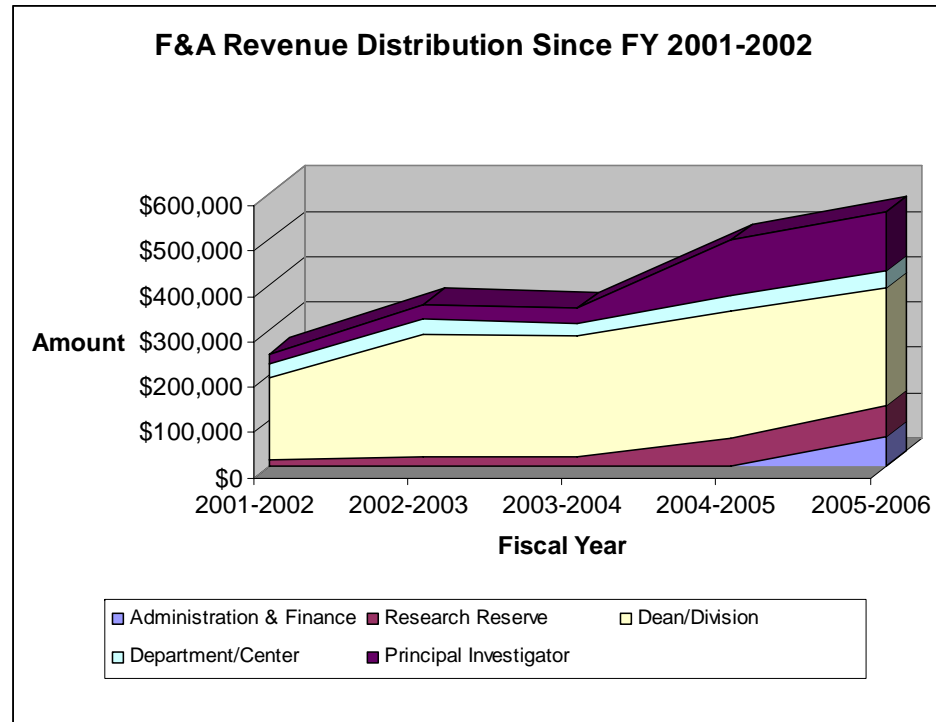
Renewals are defined as projects for which the same index number is used from year to year.

Supplements are the award of additional funds to an existing project within the established performance period.

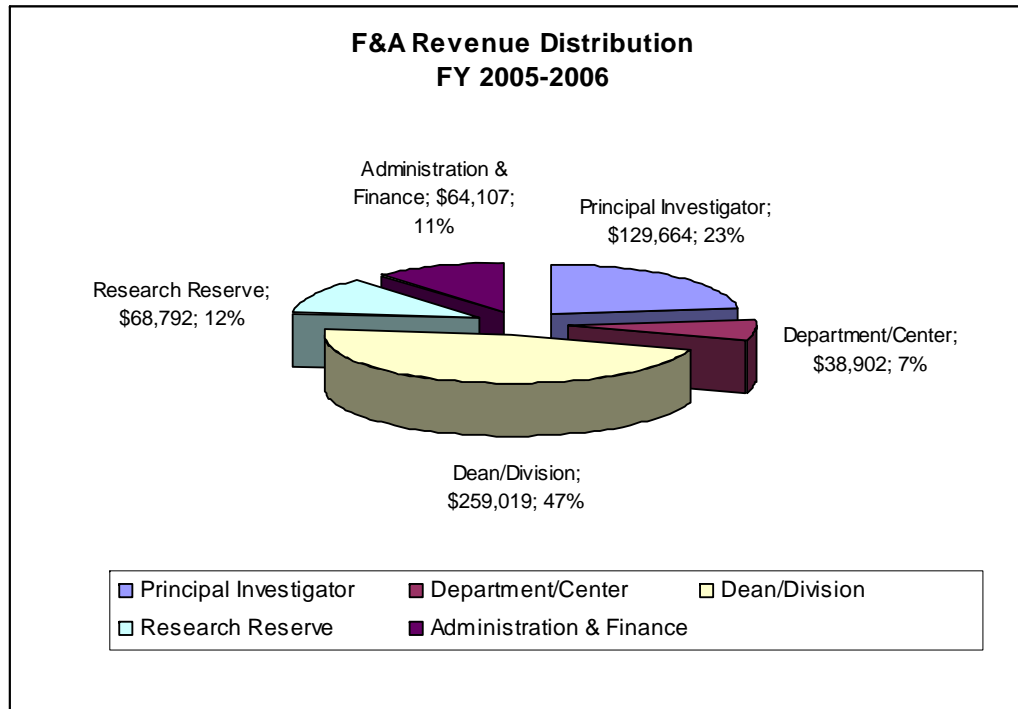
FACILITIES AND ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS REVENUE DISTRIBUTION

The Division of Sponsored Research and Training distributed \$560,485 of the Facilities and Administrative (F&A) costs recovered from sponsored projects in 2005-2006, an increase of nearly 12.5% from the previous fiscal year. Per Florida Statutes, these funds must be used to support the operation of DSRT and to be reinvested in the research endeavors of the institution. UNF shares these recovered funds with principal investigators, departments and centers, deans and divisions, and administration and finance. The remaining funds go towards the research reserve which is used to support infrastructure and development of future sponsored projects activity.

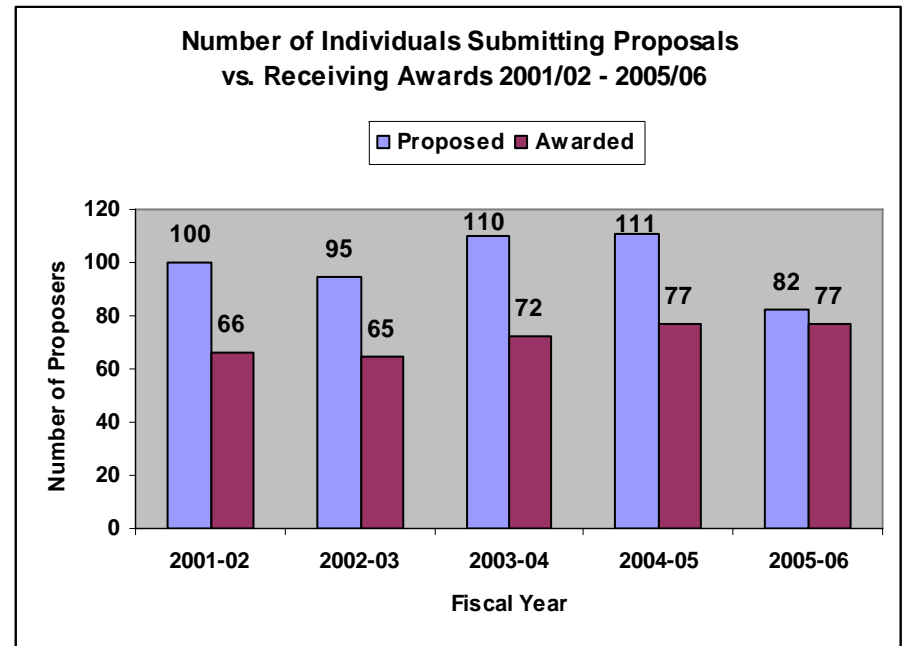
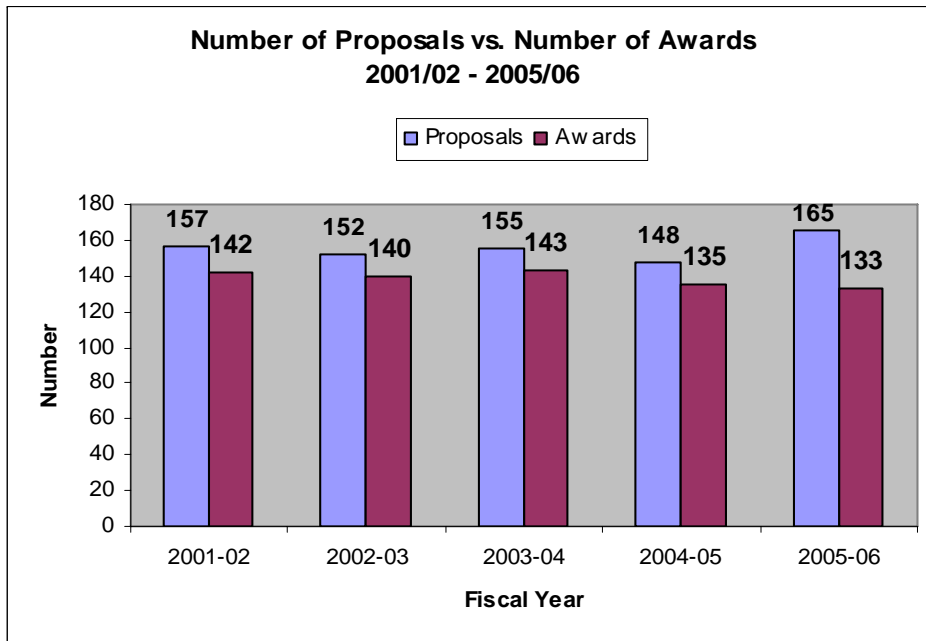
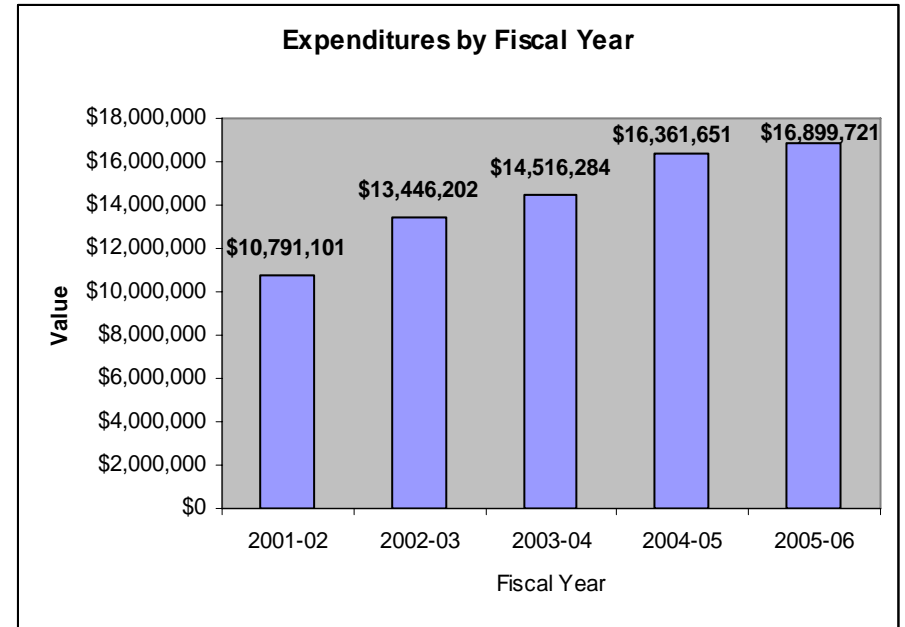
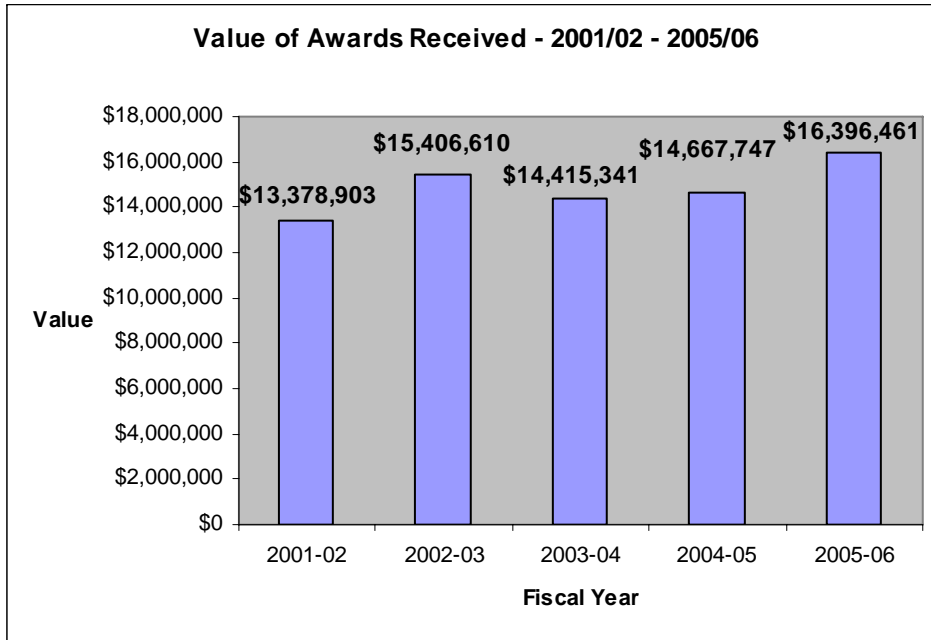

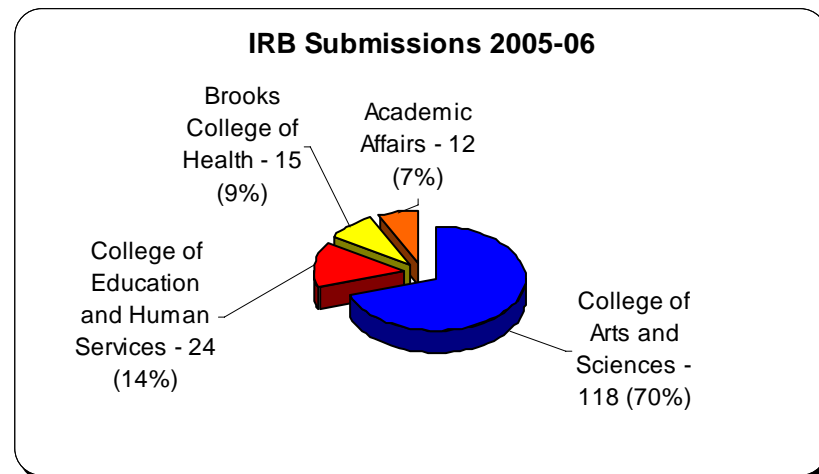
During FY 2005-06, 219 new research proposals were reviewed by the IRB:

118 from the College of Arts and Sciences (70%):
 88 from Psychology
 13 from Sociology
 17 from Communications
 24 from the College of Education and Human Services (11%)
 15 from the College of Health (9%)
 12 from Academic Affairs (7%)

Of those protocols approved,

59% were classified as exempt
 35% were classified as expedited, and
 5% were required approval by the full IRB.

10 additional research proposals were subject to annual review (expedited or full IRB review) and 16 additional requests for approval of modifications to previously approved proposals were reviewed and approved
