

1. Anita Grade is taking a test in Blackboard. During the test she accesses files from a flash drive with solutions to practice quizzes similar to the content of the quiz she is taking. The instructor confronts Anita during the test and the student states that another student referenced a sheet of paper so she assumed she could access the flash drive. Later in the day Anita emailed her instructor to say that she did know that she should not access the drive.

The instructor posts the following policy on her tests, syllabus, in the classroom and announced it prior to the test.

YOU MAY NOT ACCESS THE INTERNET nor any files, templates, help, websites, email, etc. EXCEPT to upload your file to Blackboard when you finish. Penalty=Unforgivable 'F' for your XXX course.

2. Chris C. Catt submitted an abstract for an academic journal article as his own summary. The submission is a word for word copy. When confronted C. Catt admits to plagiarizing the abstract. The assignment is a small portion of the student's total grade.
3. Wanda Aye is taking a test in class. The teacher's assistant witnessed Wanda copying answers off her classmate's test. Other students also reported seeing Wanda copy answers.
4. The teaching assistant receives a text message from a student stating that a copy of the instructor's fourth exam is in the library. The TA goes to the library and finds two students, Rose N. Krantz and Gilda E. Stern, photocopying the exam. Rose admits to buying the test from another student who took the exam in another section and sharing it with Gilda. The student who sold the exam walked out of the classroom with the test at the end of class. Rose and Gilda give the name of the seller to the TA. All students admit to the scheme.
