

DR. BARBARA A. HETRICK
Dean, College of Arts and Sciences, and Professor

Dr. Mark E. Workman is extremely pleased to announce the appointment of Dr. Barbara A. Hetrick as Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences and Professor in the Department of Biology effective August 13, 2007.

Dr. Hetrick received her Ph.D. in Botany and Plant Pathology from Oregon State University, her M.S. in Plant Pathology from Washington State University, and a B.A. in Botany/Bacteriology and German from Ohio Wesleyan University. She also completed postdoctoral work in Plant Pathology at the University of California, Riverside.

Prior to Dr. Hetrick's arrival at UNF, she was a tenured member of the Department of Biology at the University of Northern Iowa (UNI). She also served as the Head of the UNI Department of Biology for over thirteen years (1994-present). During her tenure at UNI, Dr. Hetrick served on a number of critical University committees, including the Strategic Planning Committee, the International Programs Task Force (Chair), the Educational and Student Services Task force, the Enrollment Advisory Task Force, and the Facilities Planning Advisory Committee, to name a few. She also spearheaded a number of new initiatives to enhance recruitment and retention, including the Undergraduate Research Experience, the development of a concept for graduating with Honors for Community Engagement in Science, and the development of a concept for a School of Interdisciplinary Sciences degrees.

Dr. Hetrick has an extensive publication record, including over 65 refereed journal articles and numerous books and book chapters. She has also been principal investigator or co-investigator on contracts and grants totaling almost \$8M. She continues to be active reviewing journal manuscripts (5-8 per year) and grant submissions to the National Science Foundation, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and the Environmental Protection Agency (5-10 per year).

The Department of Biology voted overwhelmingly to extend tenure as a condition of employment to Dr. Hetrick.

Dr. Donald F. Moores
Professor of Deaf Education
Department of Exceptional Student and Deaf Education

It is the recommendation of the Chair and Faculty in the Department of Exceptional Student and Deaf Education, the Dean of the College of Education and Human Services, and the Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs, that **Dr. Donald F. Moores** be recommended for the position of tenured Professor of Deaf Education (position number 32284).

Dr. Moores' Experience

Dr. Moores, currently a tenured Professor at Gallaudet University, has more than 40 years experience in the field of Deaf education and has served as a teacher of the Deaf, a program director of a teacher preparation program in Deaf education, a department chair, the director of a research center, an editor for the oldest scholarly journal in special education and the lead journal of the field of deaf education, and a full, tenured professor for more than 27 years.

Dr. Moores is a *highly accomplished scholar* with more than 250 publications including books, chapters, monographs, articles, editorials, and reviews. He is the author of the original text on educating Deaf children that is still the [leading text in this field](#). Dr. Moores' record as a scholar is exemplary and through his experience as a researcher and author, he will provide both our faculty and students with excellent opportunities to learn about and conduct scholarly work. His current book project [on exploring the international trends and developments in deafness](#) will bring international focus to the issues facing [this field](#).

Dr. Moores is also *a veteran educator* and will [bring an enthusiasm and excitement to the both the undergraduate and graduate curricula, having experience in teaching all course levels](#). In addition, Dr. Moores has chaired many doctoral dissertation committees and is willing to continue to do so as needed.

Dr. Moores' experience in *program development* will also greatly enhance the department. One key goal for the department in the next few years is to establish a Ph.D. program in Exceptional Student and Deaf Education to meet the high demand for leaders in ESDE teacher preparation programs. The deaf education field [will soon be experiencing a critical shortage of faculty](#) across the nation [due to retirement and fewer and fewer graduates with terminal degrees in exceptional or Deaf education](#). Dr. Moores has experience in exploring [doctoral programs and would be instrumental in the design of the Ph.D. program](#). [He](#) is willing to mentor faculty in the various areas related to such a program.

Finally, Dr. Moores' honors and awards include the E.A. Fay Award for outstanding scholarly achievement, USA/USSR International Research

Exchange for Scholars, Fulbright Award, honorary Professor of Huazhong University in Wuhan, China, and honorary member of the Gallaudet ASP Fraternity.

The members of the ESDE Department unanimously expressed their support of the recommendation to hire Dr. Moores as a tenured full Professor.

Dr. David Goff
Department of Communications, College of Arts and Sciences

It is the recommendation of the Faculty in the Department of Communications, the Interim Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, and the Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs, that Dr. David Goff be recommended for the position of tenured Professor and Chair of Communications (position number 31912).

Dr. Goff's Experience and Record of Accomplishment

Dr. Goff received his Ph.D. in Communication Studies in 1975 from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. He became a tenured Associate Professor of Communication at the University of Southern Mississippi in 1981. He became a Professor in that Department in 1997 and then became Chairperson of the Department of Mass Communication and Theatre Arts at the University of West Georgia in 2004.

At the University of West Georgia, Dr. Goff oversees the administration of a program which includes undergraduate students in areas of mass communications and theater arts and public speaking. These courses heavily influence the core General Education curriculum at UWG. He has authority over two media units, supervises 15 full-time faculty, is responsible for departmental strategic planning, assessment and program development.

Dr. Goff is also the founding director of the School of Mass Communications and Journalism at the University of Southern Mississippi where he left to become chair at UWG in 2004.

Dr. Goff is the author of over 8 books, essays and journal articles. He is an active scholar and will provide strong mentorship for junior and senior faculty in the Department of Communications. Dr. Goff also participates in conferences and is a presenter in national and international meetings.

In addition to his experience in teaching at the undergraduate and graduate level and his scholarship record, Dr. Goff has also received funding for internal and external grants and is the recipient of several awards including Outstanding Faculty Member, and two Excellence in Broadcasting awards. His on- and off- campus record of service is commendable. Dr. Goff will provide strong leadership in the department, the college and the University.
