- Before coming to the University of North Florida as a Visiting Professor, Dr. Gundlach was the John Berry, Sr. Professor of Business (tenured) at the University of Notre Dame where he was a faculty member for over 20 years.
- He is Senior Fellow at the American Antitrust Institute, an independent nonprofit Washington D.C. based education, research and advocacy organization, focusing on effects of business practices on competition and their implications for public policy.
- Professor Gundlach's research interests focus on vertical (e.g., supply chain/ distribution) and horizontal (e.g., competition) business relationships and practices with particular emphasis on how such associations are managed, their performance, and the nature of public policy implications that may result.
- His research has appeared in numerous academic publications including the *Journal of Marketing Research*, *Journal of Marketing*, *Marketing Science*, *Journal of the Academy of Marketing Science*, *Journal of Public Policy & Marketing*, *Journal of Retailing*, *Journal of Business Research*, *Journal of Business Venturing*, *Antitrust Bulletin*, *New York University Law Review* and the *University of Pittsburgh Law Review*.
- Professor Gundlach has been recognized as among the *Top 50 Scholars in Marketing* based on average annual citations in the "top three" journals and is among the most prolific contributors to the *Journal of Public Policy & Marketing* over its 20 year history.

DR. RADHA PYATI
Director of the UNF Environmental Center
Associate Professor of Chemistry

The Chair and Faculty of the Department of Chemistry and Physics, the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, and the Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs, recommend that Dr. Radha Pyati be appointed as a tenured Associate Professor of Chemistry and Director of the UNF Environmental Center effective August 4, 2008.

Dr. Pyati achieved her Ph.D. in Chemistry from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill after earning a Bachelor's degree from Ohio State University. She gained additional research experience in analytical chemistry as a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the University of Texas at Austin from 1995 to 1997 and then assumed a position as Assistant Professor of Chemistry at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs (UCCS).

Dr. Pyati is currently a tenured Associate Professor of Chemistry at UCCS where she has established a record of excellence in teaching, research, and service. She has taught ten different lecture and laboratory courses in chemistry at UCCS among which are Analytical Chemistry I, Electrochemistry, and Environmental Chemistry. She has contributed to the development of the chemistry curriculum at UCCS. She has provided transformational learning opportunities to students by mentoring them in original research projects. Dr. Pyati earned the Campus Outstanding Teacher Award in 2002 in recognition of her accomplishments in teaching at UCCS.

Dr. Pyati has established a record of scholarship that is fully commensurate with a faculty rank of associate professor at UNF. She has published thirteen articles in peer-reviewed journals, six of which are with undergraduate co-authors, and one of which is an invited review article. She has garnered \$127,000 in external research support, from granting agencies including Research Corporation and the National Academies as well as from research subcontracts with local corporations. She also won a competitive system-wide research grant for \$89,415, which supported her for a yearlong sabbatical at the University of Colorado at Boulder. She and her students have presented their work at several conferences such as the national meetings of the American Chemical Society and Pittcon.

Dr. Pyati has served her profession as a referee for nine journals in chemistry and has reviewed grant proposals for the National Science Foundation, Research Corporation, and the American Chemical Society Petroleum Research Fund. She also served as a technical reviewer for the Department of Energy Small Business Innovation Research Program. She has served on numerous university committees and has utilized her professional expertise to serve the public, most notably in setting up a soil analysis laboratory in 1996 in the Upper Ninth Ward in New Orleans following the Katrina disaster.

The tenured faculty of the Department of Chemistry and Physics voted unanimously to extend tenure as a condition of employment for Dr. Pyati. In addition to providing new opportunities for students in our chemistry program to gain experience in electrochemistry and environmental chemistry, she offers the expertise, communication skills, and energetic leadership required to continue the development of the programs of the UNF Environmental Center.
