

The UNF traffic and parking rule (6C9-5-1000) was re-written in an effort to remove repetitive language and to separate parking regulations from traffic regulations. In addition the following changes were made:

- **6C9-10.003 Prohibited Uses of Motorized Vehicles.** *Gravel service roads was added to keep community members from using as a roadway/traffic way.*

(3) Driving on nature trails and dirt or gravel service roads (except University service and emergency vehicles, when necessary).

- **6C9-10.004 Prohibited Uses of Non-Motorized Vehicles.** *This entire section was added to address the increased number of community members utilizing non-motorized vehicles.*

Those who operate or use a non-motorized vehicle (including but not limited to skates, rollerblades, skateboards, scooters, and bicycles) on the University campus in a manner described below, may be charged with a traffic violation, or where applicable, a Non-Moving University Parking/Traffic Infraction Citation. The prohibitions include:

(1) Failing to yield to pedestrians while operating or using a non-motorized vehicle.

(2) Operation or use of a non-motorized vehicle on the paved portions of the University campus roadways or use of a non-motorized vehicle on the University's designated nature trails.

(3) Operation or use of a non-motorized vehicle on the University campus covered walkways, in parking garages, in interior portions of buildings, within 10 feet of doorways or stairways, and in areas congested with pedestrians or vehicles. Visitors in violation of this section may be ordered to leave University property. Failure to obey could result in arrest for criminal trespass. Properly trained police officers assigned to bicycle patrol are exempt from the prohibitions of this section.

(4) Operating a vehicle in violation of the State Uniform Traffic Code, Chapter 316, Florida Statutes.

(5) Any other careless, reckless or unsafe use of a non-motorized vehicle in a marked prohibited area or in a manner that has the potential to cause harm to the operator, members of the University community, or damage to University property or other property. Examples of such conduct include, but are not limited to, trick riding, stunts, jumps or other unsafe maneuvers.

➤ **6C9-10.005 Non-Moving University Parking/Traffic Infraction Citation.**

(2) The University Police are authorized to issue a Non-Moving University Parking/Traffic Infraction Citation for any violation of the prohibited activities set forth in this regulation. The citation shall show the nature of the violation and the name or number of the issuing officer. Payment and/or appeal of the citation shall be governed by the University Parking Regulation.

(3) Individuals who desire to contest the grounds for issuance of a Non-Moving University Parking/Traffic Infraction Citation shall utilize the procedures set forth in the University Parking Regulation. The outcome of any appeal through such a process will be the final decision of the University regarding the subject citation.

➤ **6C9-10.008 Abandoned Bicycles or Other Non-Motorized Vehicles.**

*This entire section was added so abandoned bicycles could be removed, specifically from the residential areas.*

If a bicycle or other non-motorized vehicle appears to be abandoned on the University campus, the University Police may place a tag on the vehicle notifying its owner that it has ten (10) days to remove the vehicle or it will be confiscated. Confiscated non-motorized vehicles will subsequently be auctioned with the proceeds from the sale of the vehicle being utilized on behalf of the University for student scholarship funds or loan purposes.
