#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

- Green to Gold- Enlisted to Officer Program
- 4 year scholarships for high school students
- 1, 2, and 3 year scholarships (w/ established college GPA)
- Nursing Training and Scholarship Program
- Simultaneous Membership Program (SMP)
- Dedicated National Guard Scholarship
- Guaranteed Reserve Forces Duty Scholarship
- \*non-scholarship contracts also available\*

#### PATHWAYS TO BECOMING A MEDICAL DOCTOR

- Active duty with educational delay and Health Professions Scholarship Program (or United States University of the Health Sciences)
- Reserves Duty while in medical school, eligible for Health Care Professional Loan Repayment Program

#### **OTHER BENEFITS**

#### **GETTING PAID**

- Contracted Cadets will receive a tax-free \$420/month stipend
- Scholarship recipients will also receive \$1,200/ year for books as well as full tuition and mandatory fees coverage \*OR\* room and board coverage each semester
- SMP Cadets will be paid at the same rate as an E5 Sergeant during drill
- · Optional paid summer training
- Those eligible can stack GI bill benefits and receive Basic Housing allowance

 Starting pay for an Active Duty O1 after commissioning is \$3,477.39 per month plus medical and dental benefits as well as housing and substance allowance

#### **SMP**

Simultaneous Membership Program matches you with a local unit in the corps you aspire to join. This will allow you to be paid to shadow an officer in that field while completing your degree.
