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Move-In Appointments

Pre-schedule an appointment by signing into myHousing and navigating to your AY 2025/2026 housing contract by clicking “Academic Year 2025 – 2026 Contract” then selecting “Continue Your Contract”. Navigate to the bottom of the page and use the drop-down menu under “Select Next Step” and select “UNF Housing Move-in Fall 2025”. Then follow prompts to schedule your appointment.

A student’s scheduled arrival date and time is the earliest they may receive key access and begin moving in. You are encouraged to arrive during your assigned date and time but if you are unable to do so feel free to arrive later **BUT YOU MUST HAVE YOUR OSPREY1CARD**.

Move-In Day



For a smooth move-in, follow the steps below prior to check-in.

1. Bring your Osprey1 ID card.
2. Reserve your move-in appointment. Check your UNF email for details.
3. Review the Move-In Guide thoroughly so that you are fully informed before arriving to campus.

Check-In Process

On your move-in day, drive to the parking lot nearest your designated check-in location. The student will need to head inside to the designated check-in location to activate their Osprey1Card and receive instructions for parking and unloading vehicles for the day.

We encourage students to arrive at their selected move-in appointment time. Students may not arrive earlier than their selected appointment.

For any arrivals after their designated timeslot, there are 2 options

1. You should report to your designated check-in area if it is before 5 pm.
2. After 5 pm, review desk hours and availability for where to report, *only available for those with their Osprey1Card.

Don't forget your Osprey1Card prior to move-in. This card serves as a key to access your building and room.

Ease your move by bringing a hand cart, dolly, or wagon.

There will be some carts available for use. Due to the number of residents moving in, we recommend bring your own as we cannot guarantee that one will be available.

After unloading, we ask that you relocate your vehicle to a parking garage to allow other students to also be able to easily unload.

Common Policies to Know

Be sure to review the Resident Handbook for a comprehensive list of policies and expectations of living on campus. This is not a complete list but are some of the most helpful policies to know when first moving in.

Alcohol

- Alcoholic beverages and non-alcoholic beer are not permitted in first-year residence halls, even if a resident is 21 or older.
- Residents of Osprey Fountains, Osprey Village and The Flats at UNF, who are of legal drinking age (21+), may only possess, consume, and store alcohol in the privacy of their own room, suite, or apartment.
 - This excludes common areas if roommates or guests present are under the age of 21 and exterior or public areas such as apartment balconies, patios, courtyards, hallways, walkways, lounges etc.

Quiet & Courtesy Hours

- Disruptive behavior and activities, such as yelling, loud music, or excessive noise may be documented and addressed. Students and their guest(s) may be asked to leave common areas if they are being disruptive. Residents' noise level should not interfere with the academic pursuits of others in the residential areas. A student's right to quiet overrules another student's right to make noise.
 - Courtesy Hours are in effect 24 hours a day, 7 days a week both inside and outside the residential buildings.
 - Quiet hours: Enforced during the times listed below, regardless of holidays or semester breaks.
 - Sunday – Thursday 10:00 PM – 8:00 AM
 - Friday – Saturday 12:00 AM – 8:00 AM

Fire Safety

- If a building fire alarm sounds, leave the building immediately. Once you exit the building, residents should follow staff instruction and go to the nearest parking lot or clearing then wait for an all clear.
- If a smoke detector (small alarms in each room) goes off, UPD will arrive to check the room and reset the alarm.
- Tampering with the fire alarms or smoke detectors anywhere in the building including your room is a crime and will not be tolerated.

Laundry

Each of the residential areas has its own laundry facility. Osprey Cove and Crossings each have one laundry room per building. Osprey Hall and Osprey Ridge each have one central laundry facility inside the building. Osprey Fountains has one laundry facility on each floor. Flats at UNF have laundry rooms within the apartment. Osprey Village has a large laundry room available in Osprey Clubhouse. All residents have access to the Osprey Clubhouse laundry facility.

Mail

Maintenance Requests

A maintenance request is a formal way for residents to report any non-emergency issues or problems they are experiencing in their housing unit or residence hall. It could include things like broken furniture, light bulb replacement, pest problems, or broken electrical outlets, etc. You can submit a maintenance request [here](#).

If you have an emergency maintenance request, such as flooding, total power outage, or a safety/security issue, please call Housing and Residence Life immediately at (904) 620-4663. If it's outside regular business hours, please call the corresponding Welcome Desk number for your residence hall.

Residence Life Conduct



All UNF residents and their guests are responsible for abiding by all:

1. Federal and State laws
2. University rules, regulations, and policies
3. University of North Florida Student Code of Conduct
4. Housing and Residence Life Resident Handbook

Violations of any policy and/or expectation shall be considered a violation of the Student Code of Conduct and may result in disciplinary action(s). Residents suspected of

a possible violations may be documented by HRL Staff, University Police Department (UPD), and/or other University Officials. Residents could be expected to participate in a Housing or University Conduct Process and may be found and held responsible for the violations documented and issued sanctions.

Health and Safety Inspections

Housing and Residence Life reserves the right to enter students' rooms and all other residential areas for the following reasons: emergencies (health, facilities, etc.), Health and Safety Inspections, and other reasons as determined necessary to protect the safety and security of students, the UNF community, and facilities.

Health and Safety Inspections are conducted several times throughout the year to help maintain a clean and safe living environment. HRL staff will notify residents at least 48 hours prior to inspection. Inspections may take place regardless of a resident's presence. Residents are expected to work together to promote healthy living for themselves and others members. Excessive garbage, generally unclean rooms, and anything that contributes to health or fire safety concerns will be documented and the violations will be addressed by HRL Staff.

Floor Meetings

Once you're moved in, make sure to attend your floor meeting with your RA and neighbors. These mandatory meetings help you get oriented, meet your community, and learn important info about living on campus. Plus, don't miss the exciting welcome events happening all week long—there's something for everyone, and it's a great way to start making connections!

THE ROOMMATE ROADMAP

SET EXPECTATIONS EARLY

Talk about habits, routines, and shared responsibilities.

2.

KEEP COMMUNICATION OPEN

Be honest, clear, and check in regularly.

3.

SHOW MUTUAL RESPECT

Listen, be flexible, and value each other's space.

4.

STAY ADAPTABLE

Revisit and update your agreement as things change.

5.

ASK FOR HELP WHEN NEEDED

Reach out to your RA or A/RLC for support.

ROOMMATE AGREEMENTS

UNF requires all roommates to complete a Roommate Agreement early in the semester. This helps prevent misunderstandings and sets the tone for respectful living.

WHEN THINGS GET TOUGH: NAVIGATING CONFLICTS

Sharing a living space takes communication, flexibility, and mutual respect. You don't have to be close friends, but creating a comfortable environment for everyone is key. When challenges arise:

- Start with a conversation—address concerns early and calmly.
 - Focus on understanding—listen actively and work toward compromise.
 - Refer to your Roommate Agreement—it's a helpful tool for navigating expectations.
 - Reach out for support—your RA or A/RLC can help mediate and guide next steps.
- Conflict is a normal part of community living—how you respond makes all the difference.

People to Know!



Residence Life Coordinators (RLC)

The Residence Life Coordinators (RLCs) are professional full-time staff who work traditional business hours who manage the communities. RLCs are the professional staff first responder for emergencies and crisis situations for their areas. General responsibilities include supervision of RAs, educational development, and supporting emergencies and crisis situations.

Assistant Residence Life Coordinators (ARLC)

Assistant Residence Life Coordinators (ARLCs) are part-time, live-in, graduate students at UNF. ARLCs under the supervision of their supervisor develop and coordinate daily operations of their residential community. The ARLC serves as an educator for students in the community. General responsibilities include supervision of RAs, educational development, and supporting emergencies and crisis situations.

The Residence Life staff is comprised mostly of Student Staff (LCAs and RAs) and Residence Life Coordinators (RLCs), who live with the residents in the halls. They are responsible for creating programs for their floor/community, counseling residents through roommate conflicts and policy enforcement.

Resident Assistants (RA)

Resident Assistants (RA) are full-time students who serve as student staff members. Each RA oversees about 50 students and are supervised by an RLC. Responsibilities of the RA include working with students, providing programs, actively developing the residential community and enforcing policies.

Learning Community Assistants (LCA)

Learning Community Assistants (LCA) are full-time students who serve as student staff members for a Living-Learning Communities (LLC). Their primary responsibility is the community development of the LLC and putting on programs and events around the community's focus.

Engagement Assistants (EA)

Engagement Assistants (EAs) are part-time undergraduate student staff who support the marketing, event planning, resource management and student engagement efforts in the residence halls. These staff help create a vibrant community and educational experience in the residence halls.

Frequently Asked Questions

Here are answers to some common questions that are helpful to know within the first few days living on campus. For more specific inquiries, please reach out to our Housing and Residence Life office at (904) 620-4663 or housing@unf.edu.

Am I required to purchase a meal membership?

First-year students living on campus must purchase a meal membership. There are several different meal memberships to choose from. Please visit Dining Service's [website](#) for more information.

What if I want to park a vehicle on campus?

All vehicles require a valid UNF parking permit. Permits for housing residents are based on their assigned residence hall. Please visit Parking Service's [website](#) for more information.

Do I need renter's insurance?

We encourage you to invest in additional property insurance for your belongings. UNF does not insure individual belongings and does not endorse any individual insurance program. We encourage parents and students to make sure they have the protection they desire for student property, whether it is through a current homeowner's policy or separate renter's insurance. My room came with a third set of furniture. Can I remove it?

No, as outlined in the Resident Handbook policy F4.1 Furnishings provided by Housing and Residence Life may not be removed from the assigned locations. Furnishings (e.g., chairs, tables) may not be placed on balconies, patios, etc. All University Housing furniture must stay within the housing unit.

What do I do if I'm locked out of my room?

All residents get one complimentary lockout a semester. On the second lockout, you are charged a fee to get back into your room. When you are locked out, get staff assistance to be let into your room by calling or visiting your nearest Welcome Desk and a staff member will assist you to be let in.

How can I register my bike with UPD?

If you brought a bike to campus we encourage you to register it with UPD in case of theft or damage. We also encourage you to use U-LOCK to secure your bike. Register your property with UPD [here](#).

How do I connect to the internet in my room?

UNF offers eduroam, a secure global Wi-Fi service for students, faculty, staff, and visitors from participating institutions, enabling wireless access to IT resources and the Internet without cables. For information on connecting to the internet please visit the [UNF ITS Wi-Fi webpage](#).

How do I pay for my laundry?

You can pay for laundry in two ways:

1. **Speed Queen App:** Download the app, log in, add funds, and start the machine from your phone.
2. **Coins:** Pay directly with change—no app needed.

Bring your laundry, detergent, and Osprey One Card to access the laundry room.

Glossary of Common Terms

14B: The main Housing and Residence Life Office, located beside the Osprey Café

Housing and Residence Life (HRL): The official name of our housing department.

Living-Learning Community (LLC): a community that students can opt into based on their majors or other qualifications; students will live together on the same floor and usually share a class in their first semester.

Peer Assisted Tutoring in Housing (PATH): a tutoring program hosted in Osprey Fountains, open to all campus residents

Residence Life Team: The branch of the Housing and Residence Life department that oversees the building management, student staff supervision, and the community engagement experiences in the residence halls. This team includes Residence Life Assistant Directors, RLCs, ARLCs, and student staff.

Room Condition Form (RCF): The online forms for reporting room damages when a student moves in.

Roommate Agreement: A process where roommates and suitemates discuss shared expectations of their living environment and submit an eForm to their Resident Assistant. This process occurs any time a new student moves into a room.

Welcome Desk: Information desks and mail management locations, staffed by desk workers. Serve as dispatch for housing staff on call. Located in Clubhouse, the Flats at UNF, and Osprey Fountains.
