Subject: Textbook and Instructional Materials Affordability and Transparency Annual Report

Recommended Action:

Approval of Textbook and Instructional Materials Affordability and Transparency Annual Report

Background Information:

Section 1004.085, Florida Statutes, Education Access and Affordability, requires the Board of Governors and the State Board of Education to annually identify strategies to promote college affordability. Under this statute, all State University System institutions are required to submit a Textbook and Instructional Materials Affordability and Transparency Report that describes the institutional processes of selecting, adopting and posting course materials as well as course syllabi. In addition, the report must include an overview of institutional initiatives and policies designed to reduce the costs of course materials and promote college affordability.

Pursuant to Florida Board of Governors Regulation 8.003, Textbook and Instructional Materials Affordability and Transparency, each university board of trustees shall provide a report, by September 30 of each year, to the Chancellor of the State University System, in a format determined by the Chancellor

Subject: Foreign Influence Annual Report (July 2023-June 2024)

Recommended Action:

Approval of Foreign Influence Annual Report (July 2023-June 2024)

Background Information:

Regulation 9.012 by the Florida Board of Governors addresses the influence of foreign entities on state universities. It defines key terms such as "Foreign Country of Concern," which includes nations like China, Russia, Iran, North Korea, Cuba, Venezuela, and Syria, and "Foreign Source," referring to any foreign government, legal entity, or individual who is not a U.S. citizen. The regulation imposes restrictions on universities, prohibiting them from accepting gifts, grants, or entering into agreements with entities from these foreign countries without prior approval from the Board of Governors. Additionally, any such agreements must be reported semi-annually. The regulation also mandates that gifts valued at \$50,000 or more from foreign sources must be reported, and institutions are required to designate a Research Integrity Office to oversee compliance. This regulation aims to ensure transparency and safeguard against undue foreign influence in Florida's higher education system.

Starting in 2024, each state university board of trustees must annually submit a report to the Board of Governors for approval. This report should detail all grant programs, agreements, partnerships, and contracts with colleges and universities based in foreign countries of concern, as well as with foreign principals. The report must include data on these collaborations, any physical locations used or maintained in these countries, and the expected termination dates of these agreements.

In accordance with Board of Governors Regulation 10.002, Sponsored Research, each State University System institution shall annually certify to the Board of Governors that it has policies in place to negotiate, enter into, and execute research contracts including, but not limited to, policies for solicitation and acceptance of research grants and research donations, policies for the collection of fees and research donations in the context of university-sponsored research, and policies relating to the appropriate use of research funds.

Additionally, each certification will further ensure that research activities comply with applicable laws and the mission and long-term plans of the university. State University System institutions must complete the attached certification form and submit a signed copy no later than October 1, 2024.
