

## University of North Florida HEERF/HEERF II Student Portion Funding

In compliance with the quarterly reporting requirement:

1. An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

On April 11, 2020, the certification and agreement to receive the CARES Act emergency financial aid grants to students was signed by President Szymanski and submitted to the Department of Education. UNF acknowledges and certifies that no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act have been used to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

The UNF allocation for HEERF emergency financial aid grants to students funding is \$5,885,098.

### HEERF II:

The UNF allocation for HEERF II emergency financial aid grants to students funding is minimum of \$5,885,098.

3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every calendar quarter thereafter).

HEERF-As of December 16, 2020, \$5,885,098 has been disbursed and paid directly to 3,962 students.

HEERF II-As of March 31, 2021, \$3,013,200 has been disbursed and paid directly to 2,513 students.

4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. \*

UNF estimates 9,274 students could potentially be eligible to receive an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

### HEERF II:

UNF estimates 9,665 students could potentially be eligible to receive an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 314(a)(1) of the CRRSAA.

5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

As of December 16, 2020, UNF has awarded 5,336 students from the HEERF Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. As of December 16, 2020, \$5,885,098 has been disbursed and paid directly to 3,962 students.

**HEERF II:**

As of March 31, 2021, UNF has awarded 2,525 students from the HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. As of March 31, 2021, \$3,013,200 has been disbursed and paid directly to 2,513 students.

6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

For the initial awarding of HEERF funding, UNF determined eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- FAFSA on file
- Degree seeking
- Enrolled in Spring 2020 for on campus coursework as of March 13, 2020
- Remaining unmet need for award term

The award amount is based on the amount of funding available, number of students eligible and vary by student based on remaining unmet need. Award amounts range from \$200 to \$2250.

**HEERF II:**

For the initial awarding of HEERF II funding, UNF determined eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Currently enrolled undergraduate or graduate student for spring 2021
- U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen
- Remaining unmet need for award term

The award amount is based on the amount of funding available and the number of students eligible. Typical award amount is \$1200 with a range of \$200-\$2000 per aid year.

7. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

Recipients of CARES Act Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students were notified of the award via their official UNF email.
