

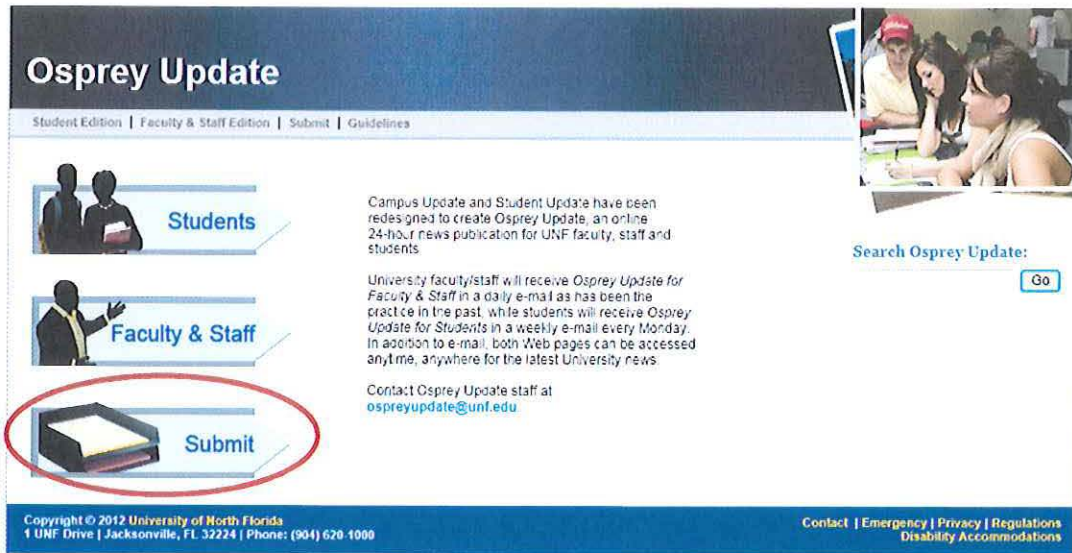


Thesis/Dissertation Changes Beginning Fall 2013

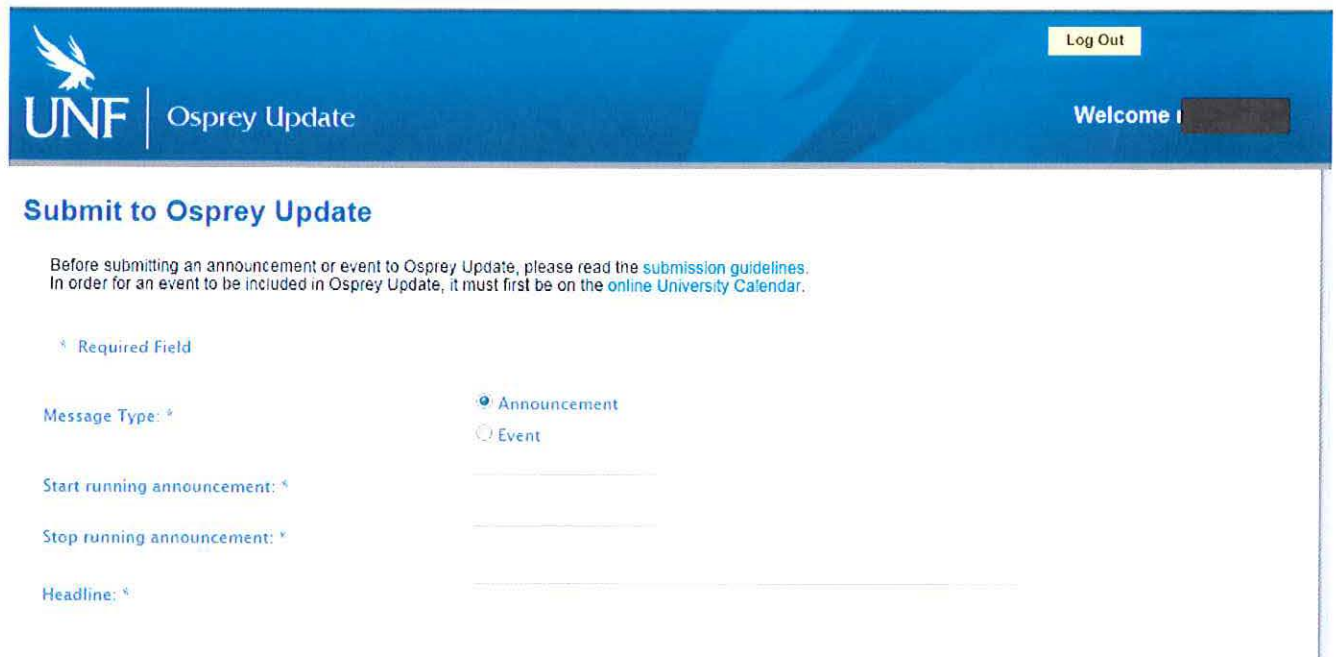
- Deadline to submit Thesis/Dissertation Committee Membership forms
 - Two weeks after graduation application deadline
 - Fall 2013 – September 27
- Deadline to defend thesis/dissertation
 - Four weeks prior to graduation
 - Fall 2013 – November 15
- Defense announcement in Osprey Update
- Thesis/Dissertation Due Date
 - Two Weeks Prior to Graduation
 - Fall 2013 – December 2 (Due To Thanksgiving Holiday)
- Copyright documentation
 - Request to Reprint/Reproduce Material Covered by Copyright

Notification of Defense for Thesis or Dissertations

1. Go to <http://www.unf.edu/ospreyupdate/>
2. Click on Submit



3. Log in using your UNF ID and MyWing's Password. The below page will appear.



4. Message Type. Click on "Announcement"

5. Start Running announcement. The announcement should be posted 10 days prior to the defense.
6. Stop Running Announcement. The announcement should stop on the defense date.
7. Headline. The headline should be Master's Thesis Defense, Doctoral Project Defense or Dissertation Defense
8. Description. The description must include the program's name, student's name, title of thesis or dissertation.
9. Contact Name. Contact name should be the committee chair or designee
10. Contact e-mail. Contact e-mail of committee chair or designee
11. Contact phone. Contact phone number of the committee chair or designee
12. Send to. The announcement should be sent to Faculty & Staff and Students
13. Category. The category is Academics.
14. Click "submit"
