The Caring Internship

University of North Florida Foundation Honorary Board Member Hugh H. Jones Jr. established the Bill and Angie Halamandaris Endowment to fund an annual scholarship for a UNF student to intern at the Foundation for eight weeks. The UNF student that is awarded this internship will receive a housing allowance and travel expenses to/from Washington, D.C. The intern will be involved in a variety of projects designed to inspire and enrich the lives and hearts of others.

The Criteria

The Caring Internship nominee must demonstrate:

- **A commitment** to voluntary service
- **Initiative and innovation** in problem-solving
- **Persistence** in overcoming obstacles
- **Advocacy for change**

The nominee must:

- Be enrolled as a junior full or part time and in good academic standing at UNF
- Demonstrate some degree of financial need
- Agree to take a Business Ethics course (PHI 2630, PHI 3641, MAN 4701, MAN 4064 or HSA 4553) prior to graduation from UNF

Student may self-nominate by submitting the essay and a letter of recommendation from professor, supervisor, or mentor.
